Company Overview & Project Needs

Vortex Optics is an American manufacturer of optical equipment. Their products include binoculars, sporting scopes and other optics accessories. Vortex is located in Central Wisconsin and their products can be found worldwide.

In redesigning their new space, Vortex was consolidating several buildings into one newly built space. They wanted the furniture to aesthetically complement their newspace while bringing comfort and quality to the employees. Ergonomics and bringing natural light to every office were contributing factors in furniture selection.

The Results

For the workspace, Day-to-Day height adjustable tables were incorporated into the Matrix Panel System to create comfort and ergonomics for employees. Panels remained low with frosted glass screens. Calibrate Series Storage and L Series Steel Storage provided optimal storage space within the 300 workstations. For the 125 Private Offices, Calibrate Series Casegoods were used, which provided visual continuity between workstations and private offices. This was also the case in the conference rooms, which used powered Calibrate Conferencing Tables. Day-to-Day tables were used throughout the space for training rooms and café tables.
